How to use Multi-Goal Compliance on the OFA platform



Supply Chain


The functionality to create a Multi-Goal policy is permission controlled. Please contact your Organisation's Admin to enable the "Compliance Policy Configuration" permission. Any user with "Supply Chain" app access will be able to select and apply a Multi-Goal policy once it has been created.

Multi-Goal Compliance


You can customise a Compliance Policy for your new and existing segments using Multi-Goal Compliance. After creating a new Compliance Policy, you can select it again for other segments.

You will need to select "Manage Supply Chain", then "Supply Chain" on the portal menu.


When creating or editing a segment in "Supply Chain", you will see the "Compliance Policy" drop-down menu here.



After selecting this, you will have the option to select an existing Community Goal (from Constructionline, Facilitiesline, Material Supplier or Builder's Profile), a Private Goal if you have one set up, or the option to "Create New".



Once you have selected "Create New", you will be navigated to the "Create Compliance Policy" page.



Name the new Compliance Policy and optionally add a description.

You will then select the Goals or Requirements you require using the checkboxes.

You can also search for a Goal or Requirement name at the top.



Use the drop-down menus to see individual Requirements within a Goal.




You can see you have the option to select "Include in Policy" and "Include in Status".

- By selecting the "Include in Policy" option, this makes the requirement mandatory in your segment. Suppliers must complete this requirement for the Buyer Connection to show as verified
- If you unselect "Include in Status", this indicates that you are interested in collecting this information, but it is not mandatory to be compliant

By default, any goal or requirement included in the policy will also be included in the status. This will make it necessary for your suppliers to have these requirements completed and verified to appear as verified in your segment.

After you have selected the requirements or goals for your Compliance Policy, complete the rest of the details of your segment and "Save".


When you add your suppliers to that segment, you will be able to view these goals on their profile in "Your Connections".



If you have selected a goal or requirement that does not already appear on the supplier's profile as part of their existing membership, the supplier will be prompted to upgrade to have access to those goals.



You can also select this new Compliance Policy when editing or creating a new segment.




Compliance Policy Analysis


You can view analytics for the suppliers in a segment with Multi-Goal Compliance set in the "Compliance Policy Analysis" section of "Analytics and Reports".

In the "Supply Chain" app, select "Manage Supply Chain".

Now select "Analytics & reports". You will be navigated to the "General Analytics" group of reports.



At the bottom of the page, use the arrow button to find the "Compliance Policy Analysis" report.




This report contains data about the Segments you have created, the Compliance Policy set for each segment and if the supplier is verified.

The first four columns include supplier data, such as their company name and Platform Registration Number.

The "Target Level" refers to the membership that the supplier currently has. "Verification Status" directly to the right of this column is the status of that membership.

The "Segment" will detail which segment the supplier is in. If you would like to filter by Segments, you can do so with the filter "Segment Name".

Compliance Policy Analysis



"Compliance Policy" refers to the Compliance Policy for the listed segment. Your Multi-Goal policies will show here. The "Compliance Policy Status" will show one of three results.

- NotMet the supplier is not yet verified on all requirements of the Compliance Policy
- PartiallyMet the supplier is verified on some requirements of the Compliance Policy
- FullyMet the supplier is verified on all requirements of the Compliance Policy

By using the scroll bar, you can view the different Community Goals or Private Goals that the Compliance Policy includes.

If you have filtered the report by Segment, the Goals that appear will only be those in the Compliance Policy of the selected Segment.
